She has been an Attending Anesthesiologist at Weill Cornell/NYP since 1995 and Associate Professor of Clinical Anesthesiology at Weill Cornell Medical College since 2002.

Trish received her undergraduate degree from Amherst College and her medical degree from the Cornell University Medical College. She completed an internship in Internal Medicine at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, residency in Anesthesiology at New York Hospital/Cornell Medical Center and fellowship in Neuroanesthesiology at Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. In 2009, she received the NYP/Weill Cornell Physician-of-the-Year Award.
